16 Halloween-colored chocolate sandwich cookies, chopped
1 1/2 cups broken small pretzels
1/3 cup raisins
1 1/2 pounds white chocolate, broken into squares
2 cups candy corn
orange and brown sprinkles

Spread the cookies, pretzels and raisins evenly onto a lightly greased small baking sheet. Melt chocolate in a bowl set over a pan of simmering water, or in the microwave, stirring frequently until melted. Remove from the heat while there are still a few chunks, and stir until smooth. White chocolate burns easily.

Drizzle chocolate with a spoon over the goodies in the pan, spreading the top flat to coat evenly. Top with candy corn and sprinkles. Let cool until firm.

Here is a bit of history on this fun holiday. The word Halloween is a shortening of All Hallows' Evening. Halloween has its origins in the ancient Celtic festival. The ancient Gaels believed that on October 31, the boundaries between the worlds of the living and the dead overlapped and the deceased would come back to life and cause havoc such as sickness or damaged crops. Masks and costumes were worn in an attempt to mimic the evil spirits or appease them.

The traditions have evolved over the years. While the original costumes were meant to communicate with the spirits, current costumes are worn for fun. Those dressed up (typically children) walk door to door saying, "trick-or-treat". The resident of the home will give a sweet treat like a piece of gum or chocolate. In addition, people of all ages will throw Halloween parties, go to haunted houses, attend fall festivals, and carve pumpkins.
